The Authority and Sufficiency of Scripture

{Psalms 19:7-10}

v.7-10) “The **law** of the LORD is **perfect, converting** the soul: the **testimony** of the LORD is **sure, making wise** the simple. (*) The **statutes** of the LORD are **right, rejoicing** the heart: the **commandment** of the LORD is **pure, enlightening** the eyes. (*) The **fear** of the LORD is **clean, enduring** for ever: the **judgments** of the LORD are **true** and righteous altogether. (*) More to be desired are they than gold, yea, than much fine gold: sweeter also than honey and the honeycomb.”

The Author of the Word

- “of the LORD” – scripture is authored by God. [2 Tim. 3:16]

The Description of the Word

- Law – teachings; instructions from God to His people on how to live a full and abundant life. [Jn. 10:10]
- Testimony – witness or decree; refers the truth of God's law.
- Statutes – precepts or rules laid out; doctrine or mandates given by God.
- Commandment – an authoritative directive either written or verbal.
- Fear – reverential awe or respect.
- Judgements – evaluations.

The Character of the Word

- Perfect – whole or complete.
- Sure – reliable or dependable. [2 Pet. 1:19,20]
- Right – correct, upright or appropriate; right path. [Ps. 119:105]
- Pure – clear, bright or lucid; easy to see.
- Clean – uncontaminated.
- True – faithful.
